VALUING PEOPLE NOW - March 2010 update

When Valuing People Now was launched it wanted people with learning disabilities to get a fairer deal.

A year on, has it made a real difference?

Now, more people are having annual health checks, more people have greater choice about where they live and there is progress developing support for people who want to find a job.

This is good news to make life better for people with learning disabilities, but just the start!

Valuing People now expect change to happen even faster in this second year of the strategy and this time next year it is hoped more people with learning disabilities will be in paid employment, have more choice about where they live and there will be more awareness of their needs at every level of government.

UPDATE ON VALUING EMPLOYMENT NOW

Update on Valuing Employment Now

(Real jobs for people with learning disabilities)

The Valuing Employment Now (VEN) team has been working with the regions, demonstration sites and partner departments to develop a range of resources to promote best practice and support local and regional delivery of VEN.

The first batch of resources will be available on the Valuing People Now website from end of March 2010

Charlotte Spencer, VEN team leader, explained: "We decided to share the resources on an online 'hub', rather than producing a printed pack, so that we can continue to build on the resources as more learning comes through"

The first batch of over 30 resources includes:

- A new 10 minute DVD, 'Real lives, real talent, real jobs' featuring the stories of eight people with moderate to severe learning disabilities in real jobs. The film also features family carers, support staff and employers;

- The Government's draft definition of support employment & job coaching

- Tools to help make sure people with learning disabilities get good support

- Case studies featuring people with moderate to severe learning disabilities in full time jobs.

'I COUNT' Register services

The 8th report of the Kingston Register for children and young people with disabilities or special needs was published in March 2010 and includes lots of statistics and details of the wider use of the 'I Count Card' (the registered trademark of Register Services).

The 'I Count Card' is sent to all registered Kingston children and young people with disabilities as they register. The card, originally valid for 5 years (now until December 2011) is distributed with a list of organisations who have agreed to accept it. A benefit is that it can be used across boroughs as well as at national attractions. AUTISM STRATEGY LAUNCHED

An Autism strategy '*Fulfilling and Rewarding Lives*' was published on 3rd March by the Department of Health and this aims to help adults with autism in England to find work and lead independent lives by making changes to public services.

Currently 15% of people with autism have a job, and 49% live at home with their parents. Although autism is not a learning disability, a 2005 National Audit Office report found that around half of people with autism also have a learning disability.

This strategy includes plans for a national autism programme board to lead the changes, guidance on making public services accessible, and autism awareness training for Jobcentre Plus staff. It also sets out a programme to develop training for health and social care staff - supported by a £500,000 investment.

Care services minister Phil Hope said "this strategy will start a fundamental change in public services" and is backed by the autism Act 2009, which requires local authorities to collect and share information about people with autism and aims to improve local planning and delivery of services.

Mencap welcome the autism strategy , however as learnt through the learning disability strategies Valuing People and Valuing People Now, implementing such plans can prove difficult and there needs to be real commitment to see this through.

PROMOTION OF PERSONAL BUDGETS 'INADEQUATE'

Local authorities are failing to provide vital information on personal budgets for disabled people, according to new research. According to the delivery plan for 'Putting People First', all English councils should be offering personal budgets by April this year and 30% of people eligible for social care support should have one by April 2011

A mystery shopper for disability charity 'Livability' contacted 103 local authorities (50%) they found that almost half of local authority websites had no information at all on personal budgets. Almost half of telephone enquiries were misdirected. Personal budgets have the potential to transform the lives of disabled people by giving them choice and control and yet awareness of them is woefully inadequate.

The City of London and Portsmouth City Council were the only council to score ten out of ten for the information they provide.

Kingston came joint 5th with Redbridge with overall score of 7.5 out of 10 - this was rated 6 out of 10 for the website and 9 out of 10 for telephone info.

SPEAKING UP ABOUT HATE CRIME

Too often people with a learning disability become victims of hate crime because of their disability and live in fear! Disability hate crime is a serious offence and if a court feels a person has been targeted because of a disability they can impose a heavier sentence. However in some case the courts have failed to prosecute cases as hate crimes. Mencap believes:

People with a learning disability should be free from the fear of hate crime All parts of the criminal justice system, including the police and the courts, should work with people with learning disabilities to stop hate crime

ADULT SERVICES ARE CHANGING

By now everyone should have received notice of these proposed changes and an invitation to the event day on the 13th May "Your Say Day"

The consultation runs until 18th May and people can say what they think of the planned changes by answering some set questions or come up with their own comments and views.

After that, they will write a report detailing the consultation results and setting out their plans for the future to the Executive committee to consider in June 2010

CAUSEWAY NEWS UPDATE

The main piece of news from the Causeway, that after 3 days of interviews, 2 new managers have been appointed to Kingston Day services.

I am pleased to let you know that after a successful interview Jean Brooks has been offered the role of Day Services Manager and will be managing and developing the day services currently running from the Causeway and will take up this appointment soon.

There was also a successful applicant for the post of work based activities and all being well with be in post in June and will take up the running and development of the Stud Farm Nursery, Victoria Park Café and the newly developed sandwich service.

We have taken the first few steps in starting a gardening service and Jeremy Osborn, who works for BTCV at Stud Nurseries, will be helping us set up a gardening service.

The best good piece of news is that the bus is now running direct to the nursery, rather than via Causeway! Jackie Batten

VETTING & BARRING

The new Vetting and Barring Scheme was launched in October 2009, when some key safeguards and legal duties came into effect, to ensure that everyone working with children or vulnerable adults are checked and registered and to prevent unsuitable people from undertaking certain paid or volunteer work.

The new scheme is designed to be both simpler and more comprehensive and will be regulated by the Independent Safeguarding Authority (ISA)

Anyone wanting to work or volunteer regularly with children or vulnerable adults will be required by law to become registered with the ISA, and employers will be legally required to check that new employees are registered.

Everyone who applies to register will be vetted in a similar way to existing Criminal Records Bureau (CRB) arrangements (this does not replace CRB checks but in addition).

On 26th July 2010 you can apply for ISA registration either as paid or voluntary worker. This means when Kingston Mencap recruit any new volunteers or workers after this date, we will be checking their ISA status.

By 1st November 2010 this registration will become mandatory for any new worker or volunteer.

This means no new volunteer or worker can start before they are registered with ISA

We are gearing up for the new changes and two Kingston Mencap trustees have already attended the government training and will register for vetting and barring.

By April 2011 all existing volunteers will need to be registered with ISA

SPOTLIGHT on our Volunteers

Kingston Mencap has always attracted a marvellous group of people to volunteer and help support us and our members, be it at one of the weekly clubs, at social events or helping to fundraise.

Some of the volunteers are parents or family members but many are friends.

We have people offering to help who have had no past contact with learning disability but just want to volunteer.

Many of our volunteers have helped us for a long time but we are always looking for new younger people to come forward.

The work we do is totally reliant on volunteers, especially when fundraising on Flag Awareness Day or helping at the Christmas Fayre (making goods before the event or helping on the day)

One thing all our volunteers have in common is that they are all interested in helping Kingston Mencap and our members with a learning disability.

NEW VOLUNTEERS

When first contact is made with Kingston Mencap we always ask volunteers to complete an application form and provide 2 referees, and once agreed we request a CRB disclosure.

Criminal Records Bureau (CRB) checks provide important protection for vulnerable people. There can be nothing more important than ensuring vulnerable members of society are properly safeguarded. In addition we will now be required to check the status with ISA (new Vetting & Barring scheme)

Volunteers help us in so many ways and we are forever grateful to them all, be it for an hour or two each week or just once a year, without you we couldn't run all the Kingston Mencap activities. THANK YOU EVERYONE
