## **NEW SAFEGUARDING STANDARDS**

New Safeguarding Standards from the Safe Network to be launched on Monday 21st February 2011 The Safe Network is a partnership between Children England and NSPCC. It is funded by the Department for Education and launched in June 2009 and it provides advice and guidance for the voluntary and community sector on child protection and safer recruitment.

The standards are designed for voluntary and community groups working with children and young people. Their aim is to help organisations work safely and in compliance with safeguarding legislation.

## **HEATHROW SPECIAL NEEDS FARM**

Many people with varying degrees of disability find great benefits from the close association with farm animals and horticulture. Here at the Heathrow Special Needs Farm, people working in our gardens and with the animals, grow in confidence and develop to their full potential. **As well as the therapeutic benefits that come from caring for the animals and plants, our aims are to educate, develop skills, provide work experience and, most importantly, to foster a sense of personal achievement and enjoyment.** 

We welcome groups or individuals for visits or we can tailor bespoke programs that can be followed on a regular and long term basis. Many of our groups have been coming to the Farm for a number of years, and it is always our visitors choice as to the activity that they undertake. This may include anything from petting the small animals, to washing our pigs, grooming the donkeys or horse riding.

For those visitors who may not enjoy being in such close contact with the farm animals they may alternatively enjoy a gentle session in the poly-tunnel, weeding, planting, harvesting or sowing. And for our more active users, digging in the gardens or poo-picking the fields may be something they choose to participate in.

No matter what a persons ability there is always an activity that can be participated in and enjoyed at the Farm. These activities may be used to support current personal development. We also welcome the elderly and work placement schemes.

We do not charge for any of the services that we offer at the farm (except horse riding), we are funded entirely by charitable donations and are grateful for all donations. So please give as much as you can afford.

# **Family Fund**

### Family Fund application process shortened

At this time of year, with winter bills and just getting over Christmas, it can be a financial strain for some families - and then the washing machine goes bang! The Family Fund helps families with severely disabled or seriously ill children and young people aged 17 and under by awarding grants for things that make life easier and more enjoyable for the disabled child, young person and their family, such as washing machines, driving lessons, computers and holidays. They have recently made their application process much quicker so if you need financial help take a look at their <u>website</u> today to find out more about how they can help.

## NEWS FROM ROYAL MENCAP.....

## **Disability Living Allowance (DLA)**

The DLA mobility component helps meet some of the extra costs disabled people can face getting around. Without assistance for extra costs, such as electric wheelchair's, mobility aids and taxis where there is no accessible public transport, people face being trapped at home. The government is proposing to replace Disability Living Allowance (DLA) with a Personal Independence Payment "to improve the support for disabled people and better enable them

Independence Payment "to improve the support for disabled people and better enable them to lead full, active and independent lives". However on 20th October the Government announced part of this change means children and people with learning difficulties living in residential care homes will lose the mobility component of DLA and this change will affect 58,000 disabled people Currently the DLA mobility component is routinely used to fund a minibus or other adapted vehicles for the use of residents at a care home. It allows residents (with staff support) to go out into the community for clubs, sports, other entertainment, and for more personal purposes such as visits to family friends. such as visits to family, friends. Access to doctors and healthcare can be facilitated through such vehicles.

We believe that the government has made a mistake and misunderstood how people use this important benefit. Without this vital lifeline, people in care will lose their independence, be unable to take part in activities that they enjoy and be cut off from their friends and family.

Mencap and a group of other charities have highlighted the issue in a report to ministers, and have set up an online petition.

## CHANGING PLACES CAMPAIGN

The Changing Places campaigns to change lives through Changing Places toilets. Standard disabled toilets do not meet the needs of thousands of people, including 40,000 people with profound and multiple learning disabilities.

Changing Places toilets have enough space and the right equipment, including a height adjustable changing bench and a hoist.

### Without Changing Places toilets, families have to change the person they care for on a cramped/dirty toilet floor or limit the outings to a few hours, or not go out at all!

The government is currently reviewing building regulations, and the Changing Places Consortium is calling for it to make Changing Places toilets compulsory in new large public buildings.

Already, over 1,000 Mencap supporters have emailed communities minister Andrew Stunell MP in support of the campaign. The government wanted evidence from families of how Changing Places toilets change lives, and the consortium ran <u>a survey</u> to collect this.

There are only 200 Changing Places toilets around the UK and you can see a map of all the existing public ones on the website: http://www.changing-places.org

The only ones we have in Kingston that comes up to standard are at the Causeway/Crescent in New Malden. Although there is quite a good one that almost comes up to standard at the Bentalls Centre but you will need a special Radar key.

## Valuing People Now - 10 years old

The 10th Learning Disability event took place in December to launch the Valuing People Now Summary Report.

Minister for Carer Services, Paul Burstow, outlined the progress that had been made the past 18 months. More people are having annual health checks, increased number of people are moving away from residential campuses and there has been some success in people finding jobs through Getting a Life and Jobs First but there was more to be done!

There needs to be more choice and control and an increase in the number of people using Individual Budgets to deliver better outcomes for individuals.

# **SPOTLIGHT : Learning Disability Service**

By now most people will have received the letter from Simon Pearce and the information update from Glen Mills with regard to the proposed changes to day services.

The council has been running a program called One Council and one of the projects affects day services for people with learning disabilities. **The Council say:** 

- The Causeway building at Cocks Crescent is not fit for purpose, is too big now that less people use it, and it also needs a lot of work doing to it
- More work activities like Stud Farm; Victoria Park and Canbury coffee shop should be developed
- There should be a new fully accessible Drop-In centre in the community
- All people who use day services should have an Individual Budget (IB)
- HFT and other providers should continue to provide day opportunities
- Transport to and from day services will be affected

On 1st March a Report will go to a meeting of the full council and if the report is agreed there will be a 3 month consultation starting on 7th March

The consultation will include some ideas about how day services may change and there will be lots of meetings arranged to discuss everyone's views.

These will be open meetings and will give everyone the opportunity to have their say and to ask questions.

The consultation will end on Friday 3rd June.

The council will then look at all the information provided by people with learning disabilities, families and carers, support providers, The Parliament and from us - Kingston Mencap.

Final plans will be published in July and put into action during the summer.

### Seekers Club members and their families and carers will be directly involved and they will all be given the opportunity to voice their concerns.

NB. We have been looking for new premises for many months, as we never knew if Seekers club would have to move because of damage to the building following the roof leak and recent flooding.

We will keep members informed whilst looking for a new venue but are still hopeful that new Drop-In planned for the community will be big enough!

We may have to use a temporary venue but I am confident Seekers will continue for many years to come. Members may worry but I am sure will adapt to the changes and Zerrin Izli, Seekers club leader, will keep everyone informed.
