CARERS GROUP UPDATE

The Carers group have continued to meet up on a monthly basis on the first Wednesday of the month. And to make sure everyone gets the opportunity to attend we meet on alternative months - HFT in the afternoon and Staywell in the evening. Please note we are changing venue for the next two evening meetings on 2nd September and 4th November and will be meeting at Session House, 17 Ewell Road, Surbiton (instead of Staywell to help keep costs down)

In **May** Emma Knapp was the invited speaker and came along to talk about Brokerage and Individual Budgets. Emma outlined some of the main changes, partly because of reduced resources and shared a draft copy of a new IB Agreement inviting comments. I am not sure how far this has been distributed to all families/carers, but a copy should have gone out to all those who manage their family member's Individual Budget. In **June** Dennis Pennec and Melissa Hulbert from HFT were our invited guests.

Dennis now manages both LACE and Residential placements which has made a huge difference as he has a good overview. Both Dennis and Melissa talked about the day centre generally and welcomed suggestions and ideas from those present to increase and offer different day centre activities.

There have been great strides to improve the day centre experience with longer sessions in the community, back to longer day ramble and not so much trailing around the shops, but resources are tight and there is also a new staff structure chart showing who is who which is very helpful in identifying and knowing names. Families present said they valued HFT and all that it offers, as a safe place for their family member and the opportunity of respite with no worries or cares for the day! A few of met up for dinner to celebrate Carers week on 10th June at the Watchman in New Malden and enjoyed dinner with plenty of chat and wine!



In **July** Denise Lovemore (head of care managers) came back to update carers on the comments raised with regard to the Annual Review Process and how it could be improved upon. Denise promised to take back our comments with regard to sending out a draft word document, so families could advise on any omissions or errors, very soon after the reviews date. I am very happy to now share with you that this has been agreed and families and carers will receive a document containing the review outcomes, hopefully only 1-2 weeks following the review date! With the lack of resources they need to work more with families and Denise talked about a new integration model where everyone is more involved. They want families to send in information before the review so the officer carrying out the review will know where and what to prioritise on the day. As we all know carers have known their family member longest and most probably best, so this seems a good way forward, but more work falls on the carer!

With the Care Act coming in this past April there has been a lot of work and information which has to be joined up and there is a new booklet RBK booklet "Adult Social Care Services" - guide to services to help



you stay independent, safe and well and another new booklet about the Care Act – both should be available from Sessions house or Guildhall.

At the July meeting we were also joined by Frankie Hooper, who with her husband David came to tell us about her 1 bed independent respite flat in Chessington, attached to the family home. Many people will know Frankie from her 10 years working at HFT and David from the Balance sandwich business. There are

opportunities for people still living with the family, and one of the first steps toward supported living. They help increase independence, especially for those with challenging behaviour and can support families and can give a tailored service to broaden community activities and to meet an individual's need.

At the meeting I normally make notes and these can be circulated by email, especially those with a speaker. Do let me know if anyone wants to suggest a speaker for future meetings or if anyone wants further information on a particular subject. If you are not on email, then please give me a ring and request information to be sent by post. There is no meeting in August because of the holiday period so the next meeting is 2nd September at Session House at 7.30pm. At a later date in September we are hoping to invite David Still from KCN along to help us understand PIP (Personal Independence Payment) in readiness for the letters that will be dropping on mats in October.

WHO TO TALK TO IF YOU HAVE A CONCERN...

Here is some guidance on what to do if you have a concern about your Support Provider (or the Support Provider of the person you are representing):

- Contact the Provider directly. Speak to the Senior Support Worker or Manager. Each Provider should have their own information about how to make a complaint or give feedback and compliments
- If you feel that your issue is not resolved, speak to a Care Manager in the Community Learning Disability Team (0208 547 6558). They should be able to talk to the Provider on your behalf and help to address your concern. They will also raise this with the Team Leader who can record your issue as a Serious Concern is appropriate or advise you if Safeguarding Procedures need to be followed.
- If the issue is still not resolved and you think your concern affects more than one person, you can ask for it to be raised at the Learning Disability Quality and Commissioning Action Group. The family/carer representatives on this group are Gill Wood (<u>gillcwood@blueyonder.co.uk</u>), Heather Notermans (<u>heathernot@hotmail.com</u>) and Mary McDonald (<u>mary.mcdonald@blueyonder.co.uk</u>). They can also be contacted through the Kingston Mencap admin phone number, 020 8816 7500 (office hours Monday and Tuesday, 9.30am-2.30pm; monitored answerphone at other times).

LD PARLIAMENT UPDATE



Parliament has been very busy out and about gathering people's views and getting voices heard in Kingston and in London!!

Parliament attended the 'No Voice Unheard, No Right Ignored' consultation event where we spoke up about people in treatment and assessment units. Parliament's ideas and thoughts will go into the consultation report being sent to government. It was a good networking event and we got meet other organisations like ours from other boroughs. Peer Advocates, Project Workers and Facilitators won a special Police Commendation Award for their work with Safe Places. A number of training sessions were delivered to Police



Officers in Kingston about Keeping Safe. This training has been adopted by other London boroughs. Well done to Warren Day, Katy Bessent, Robert Smith, Marie Cummings and Nancy Magid for their hard work .

Leader of the Council Kevin Davis visited the Parliament Team Meeting this month. Peer Advocates

explained more about Parliament's purpose, the work we have been doing, and our plans for the future. We asked him questions about housing and making consultations and communications accessible

We have also been busy raising awareness about Learning Disabilities to year 6 students in schools across the borough. Last month, Santosh Beharry, Greg Rata and Graeme Green attended a 'drop down' day at Chessington community college, where we hosted a workshop, gave out questionnaires and showed a film about Learning Disabilities. It was a really good day and students were engaged and asked lots of questions.

Parliament also attended the Kingston Chambers of Commerce Employment Expo to see if it is a good place for Parliament to raise awareness about the benefits of employing and maintaining people with Learning Disabilities in paid work. We are planning to talk in a seminar at next year's Expo.

A new 'Surveyor' position has been awarded to Eve Hogben to carry out various access checks on

venues in the borough. This is a paid role developed by Parliament, in partnership with DisabledGo and Balance. Congratulations to Eve!

We also held an Open Day at Kingsmeadow in May to promote Parliament to people and to give updates on our work. We had presentations, lunch and even some drama through role play sessions. Please come along to our next Open Meeting, which will be held on Tuesday 15th September at 10.30am to 1.30pm (venue to be confirmed).
