OFSTED REPORT

The Ofsted report with damning safeguard failings, way back in July, was really shocking and a major blow. No one could understand how Kingston had been classed as "inadequate" with many serious issues needing to be addressed. Kingston Council are now carrying a comprehensive audit to carefully check out practices and processes to make sure they are right to deliver the best results for Kingston's children and young people.

NEWS FROM ROYAL MENCAP.....

OUT OF SIGHT - REVIEW OF WINTERBOURNE ABUSE

The recent serious case review into the abuse at Winterbourne View gave us all a chilling memory of last year's Panorama programme when we watched in horror, some having to switch off in tears, at the abuse that had been going on! The review found that concerns were raised before the abuse was uncovered by secret filming, but nothing was done. It says places like this should not exist and there is an urgent need to "begin the complex task of commissioning something better"

The new Care Quality Commission (CQC) official report shows that less than 48% of hospitals and care homes comply with 'essential' standards. Concerns were fewest at NHS run services with privately run services most likely to fail both core standards, but biggest concerns were at council run care homes.

The new "Out of Sight" campaign report by Mencap and the Challenging Behaviour Foundation is now out and wants to make sure these kind of places are closed.

Some people are sent to these kind of units because they are not getting the medical support needed in the community.

Chrissy features in the campaign report and she was sent to a similar unit because she was in a terrible state and when she arrived she had bald patches from pulling her out and self inflicted wounds and bruises. Her family were supportive of the move as they wanted to her be safe and to be treated but she is still there almost 3 years later.....

Things will only change if the government takes action to make sure people like Chrissy are given the care they need in local services so there family are there to see them regularly and to offer support.

There will be a debate in Parliament on 3rd September so lobby your MP to make sure they attend and help stop abuse and neglect for people like Chrissy....

MENTAL CAPACITY ACT Resource Pack

Mencap has launched a new Mental Capacity Act resource pack to help families and carers make bet interest decisions.

The Mental Capacity Act supports and protects people who may be unable to make some decisions, including people with profound and multiple learning disabilities (pmld). Often the person's family will make these decisions, but sometimes others (such as a doctor or local authority) must make the decisions, however anyone making best interests decisions must consult with their family.

Mencap has produced a resource pack for families and carers of PMLD which will enable their involvement in best interest decision-making, to equip them with information and help them understand how it impacts on decisions.

SPOTLIGHT: Independent travel projects

As part of the day service re-structure last year RBK Learning Disability Service agreed some funding to support more people with learning disabilities to travel independently.

A one year contract with Community upon Thames, a local social enterprise, has just been signed to develop travel projects in Kingston.

- The aim of the project is to support more people with learning disabilities to use public transport, independently or with support
- Community upon Thames offer **Travel Training** for those want to learn to travel independently, and can help people who may need on going support to use public transport to get a **Travel Buddy**.
- They will also be running First Route aimed at giving people with learning disabilities more confidence when travelling on buses and understand more about keeping safe when travelling. It is also a useful opportunity for staff who may be supporting anyone who finds accessing buses difficult for any reason.
- The project will also support people who want to use their Individual Budgets to travel differently.
