It is very important we remain vigilant to ensure services are not cut here in Kingston and that people are kept safe and are happy and well supported with good experienced staff that really care!

SATURDAY DROP-IN

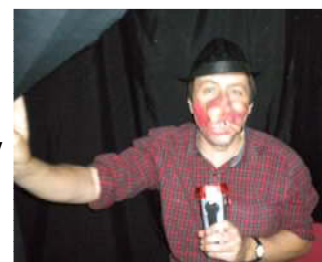

SPOTLIGHT on Medical Negligence & People with a learning disability

"The quality of care in the NHS and social services for people with learning disabilities is at best patchy and at worst an indictment of our society" - Ann Abraham, Health Service Ombudsman

"If she had been a normal young woman, we would not hesitate to treat her" – Health Professional to family of child with a learning disability, as reported in Mencap's Report, Death by Indifference

Medical negligence (also called Clinical negligence) claims are a way for people who have been harmed because of unacceptably poor medical treatment to obtain compensation. The sub-standard medical treatment could have been from a doctor, nurse, physiotherapist, hospital staff, dentist or anyone else involved in the medical professions.

Negligent medical treatment can happen to anyone, but unfortunately it occurs with alarming frequency to people with learning disabilities. One example is a man with a learning disability who was admitted to hospital following a stroke and died a month later as a result of not being given proper nutrition. Mencap investigated the death and concluded:

"We believe that the real, underlying cause of Mark's death – and those of many other people with a learning disability who die in hospital – is the widespread ignorance and indifference throughout our healthcare services towards people with a learning disability, and their families and carers."

What should you do if you are concerned that someone with a learning disability has been treated negligently in hospital, by a GP, or by another medical professional?

The first thing you should do is make an official complaint. To do this you will need to obtain a copy of the Complaints Procedure from the hospital or surgery where the incident took place and then write or speak to them in accordance with the procedure. The hospital or surgery will write back to you giving a response to your complaint. If you are unhappy with the response you can refer the matter to the Parliamentary and Health Service Ombudsman. This procedure does not provide compensation for the injuries or loss that you are complaining about, but it does give you an opportunity to raise your concerns about the care received.

The only way to get properly compensated is to bring a medical negligence compensation claim and to do this you will need to instruct a solicitor. The general rule is that there is a three year deadline for bringing claims. However, there are exceptions to this for children and in some circumstances, for people with learning disabilities. So you should still contact a solicitor even if the incident happened many years ago. You should not delay seeing a solicitor because you are going through the Complaints Procedure.

Medical negligence is a complex area of law. However, if you have an experienced and sympathetic solicitor it is not as daunting as you might think. Where someone is not capable of bringing a legal action themselves – for example, because it is too complicated for them to understand – a family member is usually able to step in and bring the action on their behalf.

How much will it cost to bring a claim?

Many people with learning disabilities will be entitled to legal aid for medical negligence cases and therefore it will not cost them or their families anything. Very few solicitors firms are authorised to bring legal aid cases so it is critical to check that your solicitor has this authorisation before instructing him or her.

Where legal aid is not available it may be possible to bring claims under a "no win, no fee" arrangement.

What amount of compensation can be obtained and how will it affect your benefits?

The amount of compensation depends on the type of injury suffered and how it has affected your life. If the injury means you are no longer able to work or have serious care needs you may be entitled to a large amount.

It is usually possible for your solicitor to structure the compensation award so that it does not affect your benefits. If necessary, the solicitor can also make arrangements that someone is appointed to be responsible for ensuring the money is used wisely.

Conclusion

Medical negligence is a very serious matter. It is therefore important to only use a solicitor who is experienced in this area of law. Before instructing a solicitor you should ask if he or she:

- is on the Law Society Clinical Negligence Panel
- is able to get legal aid for you
- has experience in arranging damage awards so that they do not affect benefits
- has experience of working with people who have a learning disability
